17 This schedule is for electric service required for automatically controlled dusk-to-dawn security
18 lighting of privately-owned roads or streets, and privately or publicly owned yards, driveways,
19 parking lots, walkways, parks, recreation areas, buildings and similar areas. All lighting is
20 subject to approval by Provo City Power.
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23 **CHARACTER OF SERVICE**

24 Service under this schedule shall be single-phase, 60 Hertz, alternating current at the Energy
25 Department’s available standard distribution voltage. Standby or resale service is not permitted.

The unit charge includes installation, maintenance and energy costs for a unit on an existing or new pole without guys. Where more than one pole and more than 200 feet of extension are required, an additional monthly charge of 1.5% of the estimated additional cost will apply. Poles can be paid up front or billed over a twelve (12) month period.

SPECIFICATIONS AND SERVICE

Each lamp will be mounted on an existing pole or on a pole with a height of approximately 25 feet or greater, with a mast arm bracket not exceeding 4 feet in length. Service includes energy supplied from the Energy Department’s electrical circuits, maintenance of lamp and glassware renewals. The Energy Department will replace all burned-out lamps during regular working hours as soon as practicable following notification by the customer that such maintenance is necessary. Lamps should burn each night from dusk to dawn.

The Energy Department reserves the right to enter the customer’s premises, without being subject to trespass, at all reasonable times for the purpose of inspecting, maintaining and installing or removing equipment or facilities. The customer may be requested to reimburse the Energy Department for the cost of any maintenance work required due to vandalism.

LIMITATION OF SERVICE

Lights to be served under this schedule shall be located, in the opinion of the Energy Department, where they are easily and economically accessible to the equipment and personnel required for construction and maintenance. Steel poles may only be located where they are easily accessible to an Energy Department bucket truck.

Lighting fixtures shall be installed on Energy Department-owned poles only. The location of lighting fixtures shall be determined by mutual agreement and shall not be in locations which create a public nuisance. Substantial complaints registered by other customers affected by the light(s) may, at the Energy Department’s discretion, be grounds for removal or relocation of said light(s).

The Energy Department, while exercising reasonable diligence at all times to furnish service, does not guarantee continuous lighting and will not be liable for damages resulting from any interruption, deficiency or failure of service. The Energy Department also reserves the right to interrupt service at any time for necessary repairs to lines and equipment or for system protection. The customer will assume responsibility for keeping trees, shrubs and other plants clear of the lighting fixture and the wires serving the lighting fixture.

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102 If the Energy Department is required to remove or replace existing high-pressure sodium vapor
103 lighting fixtures under this schedule, thereby forcing premature retirement of the existing
104 fixture, the customer will pay the Energy Department an amount equal to the depreciated value
105 of all equipment removed or replaced, as well as the cost of removal less any salvage value.

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107 **TAX ADJUSTMENTS**

108 The amount computed at the above Monthly Rate shall be subject to taxes, assessments and
109 surcharges imposed by Provo City or any governmental authority authorized to levy said taxes,
110 assessments or surcharges.

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112 **TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

113 Service under this schedule will be in accordance with the Energy Department’s electric
114 service standards and policies and terms and conditions set forth by the Department’s standard
115 application requirements and Provo City Ordinances, including any future additions or
116 amendments.

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
